Club Rules

Competition Entry

- Competition entry is through the HowDidIDo website or app or the PSI unit in bar/reception.
- Weekend competitions open for booking every Monday at 7am, 2 weeks before the competition. No restriction for entry in midweek comps at present.
- You can remove your own name from the start sheet up to 12pm the day before the competition using HDID. Failing to turn up for your tee time if your name is on the HDID competition start sheet will result in disqualification from the competition (Rule 5.3a) and your name being removed from the following competition and placed on the bottom of any reserve list. (no exceptions)
- Failure to complete round by walking off the course without reasonable excuse will result in a two-competition ban.
- Prize Money for comps given as vouchers at the annual presentation is:
 - Monthly comps: 1st £40 - 2nd £30 - 3rd £20 - 4th £10
 - Midweek comps: 1st £35 – 2nd £25 – 3rd £15
 - Leagues: 1st £75 - 2nd £50 - 3rd £25.
 - Scratch and Handicap KOs: 1st £100 - 2nd £50
 - Seniors Handicap KO: 1st £65 – 2nd £35
 - Greensomes KO 1st £100 per pair - 2nd £50 per pair
 - Order of merits: 1st £75 – 2nd £50 – 3rd £25
 - All Hustles are self-funding.

New Members

New members joining the club without an existing WHS handicap index must follow this process to gain a handicap and win club competitions.

- They must enter scores for 54 holes to gain a handicap index (This will give them access to HowDidIDo). To get the scores they must arrange to play social rounds with a club member who will sign their card and upload their cards to the secretary. No space will be reserved for them in club competitions unless there are spaces available not taken up by a club members, this is due to club competitions being highly oversubscribed.
- Their handicap index will be based on the lowest (18 hole) gross score -2 (WHS Rules) this will allow them to book into competitions using HowDidIDo.
- To win a club competition a minimum of 10 scores in club competitions must be achieved. This will give a handicap index based on the average of the three lowest scores which gives a truer indication of the players ability.

Etiquette

- The overriding principle is that consideration and respect should be shown to others on the course at all times.
- Respect for the course – leave the course as you would like to find it by repairing pitch-marks, replacing divots and raking bunkers
- Respect for your fellow players – be sportsmanlike and polite, stay by the green to watch them hole out, and avoid distracting them
- Respect for the game – by knowing the Rules and etiquette of golf
- Give way to players on any hole in front of you e.g. players on the first should give way and wait for players on the second to clear both fairways.

In the case of a serious breach of etiquette, the Committee may disqualify a player under Rule 33-7.
